The Museum of Us - an exhibition created by the young people from the Young Migrant Education program at TasTAFE	Young people from rerugee and migrant background have organised and created an exhibition titled The Museum of Us. The young people are all studying English at TasTAFE and have come from over 12 different countries including Afghanistan, Iran, Pakistan, Syria, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Kenya, Sudan, Burma, Ecuador, Colombia, Thailand and Japan. The exhibition was inspired by recent visits to the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery and MONA. The students have collected important artefacts from their lives and written or recorded the story behind the object. Some examples are a medal for winning a running race in Kakuma refugee camp in Kenya, a special Ethiopian coffee cup handed down through generations and a letter which helped someone escape from the Taliban in Afghanistan. Working with their TasTAFE teachers to create the exhibition the young people have learnt more about each other as well themselves. Now they are ready to share these stories with more Tasmanians for Harmony week. Pattamawan Krutkong said, "Usually people overlook the small objects but this project made me realise that they are important. Hearing the stories brought back many memories." Zahra Qasimi said, "This has been invigorating and I think it has made us grateful for our life, grateful for being here in Hobart, grateful for now." As Hadisa Teimoori says, "These artefacts represent our history, where we have come from and what we have been through. When people come to this exhibition, they will understand more about us and that will help the Tasmanian community to find solutions to issues like racism."
